- 1 In what way is Iswaran an asset to Mahendra?
- Or Mention any two qualities of Iswaran which made him an asset to Mahendra.
- Ans. Iswaran was called Mahendra's asset because of his complete dedication towards his master. He cooks for him, washes his clothes and chats with him at night. He was also a great storyteller and entertains Mahendra with his stories. Thus, he was a hard-working and loyal servant.
 - 2 How does Iswaran describe the uprooted tree on the highway? What effect does he want to create in his listeners?
 - Or How did Iswaran the storyteller describe the uprooted tree?
