- 1. How does the poet describe the rain?

Ans: The rain water gushes and struggles at of the spout of the pipe.

4. Which words or phrases help you understand that it is a heavy rain?

Ans: 'How it clatters along the roofs'- this line states that it is a heavy rain.

- 2. Read the poem once more and answer the following:
- 1. 'Heat' rhymes with 'street's. What are the other rhyming pairs you find in the poem?

**Ans:** Rain – lane; roofs – hoofs; out – spout; wide – tide; pours – roam;

2. 'It clatters along the roofs like the tramp of hoofs. It is a simile. Can you find another simile? Can you find another simile in the poem?

**Ans:** 'It pours and pours..... like a river down the gutter roars'- is a simile.
