- **Example:**Please give me the red hammer, the blue one is too small.
- The indefinite article indicates that a noun refers to a general idea rather than a particular thing. The indefinite article takes two forms. It's the word a when it precedes a word that begins with a consonant. It's the word an when it precedes a word that begins with a vowel.

 - Please hand me a book; any book will do.
 - Please hand me an autobiography; any autobiography will do.



Therefore, it has to be changed to the Passive voice, where something is done by the subject and it is 'passive'.

In order to do that:

- the verb should be changed from the Active voice to the Passive voice without changing its tense ('promised' to 'was promised' and 'will cook' to 'will be cooked')
- The object of the transitive verb in the Active voice should become the subject of the verb in the Passive voice.

The same sentence in the Passive voice should be 'My husband was promised by me that food will be cooked for him by me'. However, none of the given options are framed this way.

It is Option 1 that comes the closest to expressing the given sentence in the Passive voice. 'I promised my husband...' is the same as 'I made a promise to my husband...', and the latter in the Passive is 'A promise was made by me to my husband...'.

Therefore, the correct answer is Option 1 as it comes the closest to expressing the given sentence in the Passive voice.

Option 2 is incorrect because it does not change the first half of the sentence to Passive voice.

Option 3 is incorrect because it does not change the first half of the sentence to Passive voice.

Option 4 is incorrect because it changes the very form of the original sentence by adding the verb 'wanted' and does not change the second half of the sentence to Passive voice.
