

DU UG Admission through CUET

Delhi University UG Admission 2022 through CUET: The registration process of CUET UG 2023 commenced already. According to the latest update by NTA, the last date to submit the application form is March 30, 2023. CUET 2023 is scheduled to be conducted from May 21, 2023, to May 31, 2023. The results for the same will be released in the third week of June 2023. After the declaration of CUET 2023 results, the admission process of DU for UG admission will commence.

Delhi University (DU) UG admission through CUET 2023 application form will be released in the month of July 2023. The admission policy for UG admission was revised in the year 2022. Candidates seeking UG admission had to take the Common University Entrance Test (CUET). DU has also discontinued the DUJAT exam; admission to BBA, BMS, and BBE programmes will now be based solely on the CUET. The candidate must appear for CUET UG 2023 exam in order to take admission in DU. DU also accepts applications for postgraduate courses. CUET exam 2023 will be used to determine DU admission for undergraduate courses in 2023. Candidates must have completed 10+2 with at least 50% aggregate marks to be considered for admission. The selection will be made through e-counselling by Delhi University based on CUET 2023 scores. Find out everything about DU UG admissions in the article below.

Steps to Apply for DU UG Admission 2023

Apart from the above-mentioned direct link, the candidates can visit the official website to start the DU CSAS registration 2023. The candidates can refer to the below-mentioned steps to apply for the DU CSAS 2023 admission.

The candidates need to visit the official website, admission.uod.ac.in

Then, click on the “CSAS registration link” on the homepage

UG admission merit list needs to be selected

Fill out the application form carefully

Upload the required documents in the prescribed format

Pay the application fee

Click on the submit button

DU UG Admission 2023 Application Fee

The candidates have to make the payment in an online mode. The fee is different from one category to another. Check the category-wise DU CSAS application fee here in the following table.

Category	DU CSAS Application Fee (Rs)

Note: If the candidates will want to apply for the ECA or/ and Sports supernumerary quota, then they must pay an additional fee of Rs 100 for each quota. Once the candidates make the payment for DU CSAS admission 2023, the amount will be non-refundable.

DU UG Admission Eligibility Criteria 2023

It has been officially announced that CUET will be an admission channel for Delhi University in 2023. The DU merit list 2023 will be compiled based on the marks earned by candidates in the CUET 2023 exam.

There is no upper age limit for candidates taking the CUET UG 2023. Candidates who have passed the class 12th/equivalent examination or are appearing in 2023, regardless of their age, are eligible to take the CUET UG 2023 examination. Candidates must, however, meet the age requirements (if any) of the university to which they wish to apply.

Note:

1. For admission to universities through CUET UG 2023, the existing policies of the respective university regarding quota, category, relaxation, reservations, qualification, subject combinations, preferences, and so on will apply.
2. Because the admission criteria for each university may differ, candidates are advised to visit the website of the university to which they are applying for their respective programmes.
3. Candidates should ensure that they meet the eligibility requirements of the university to which they are applying before filling up the application form.
4. Mere participation in the Entrance Test or achieving pass marks in the test does not entitle a candidate to be considered for admission to the Programme unless

he/she meets the Program-specific eligibility requirements of the University to which they are applying.

DU UG Admission Course-Wise Eligibility Criteria 2023

At the undergraduate level, Delhi University offers full-time courses such as BA, BSc, and BCom. The Common University Entrance Test will be used to determine admission to these courses (CUET). As per CUET 2023 eligibility criteria, candidates must have at least 50% in class 12 to be considered for admission.

The table below lists some of the course-wise eligibility requirements for the various specialisations offered by DU 2023 through the BA, BSc, and BCom programmes:

DU UG Admission 2023

Undergraduate courses at Delhi University include Engineering (BTech courses), Arts, Science, Pharmacy (BPharm course), Education, Fine Arts, Architecture, and Commerce, among others. Up until 2021, the majority of these courses offered admission based on Class 12 merit scores, with the remainder offering admission through university/national/state-level entrance exams. However, beginning in 2022, admission to all UG courses will be contingent on a valid CUET score from NTA.

At the undergraduate level, Delhi University offers courses such as BA (Prog), BA (Hons), BSc (Gen), BSc (Hons), BCom, BCom (Hons), and BVoc.

DU UG Course-Wise Admission Criteria 2023

It has been officially announced that CUET will serve as an admissions channel for Delhi University beginning in 2023. The DU CUET merit list 2023 will be compiled based on candidates' CUET exam scores.

Following are the Delhi University course-wise admission criteria mentioned below:

Courses	Admission Criteria
BA courses	Candidates must take the entrance exam in one language from section one and three subjects from section two.
BSc courses	Merit will be determined based on CUET results in Physics, Chemistry, Mathematics, or Biology.

Linguistic courses	Candidates can take the test in any language or choose a specific language.
BCom, BVoc, BA Pass	Candidates can choose between a language exam, one domain-specific subject, a general examination, or a three-subject exam.
BBA, BBE, BMS	One language test, one math test, and one general test
BA Economics Hons	Candidates are required to take the mathematics exam. Merit will be determined by the results of one language test, one mathematics test, and two domain tests.

Quick Facts About DU CUET 2023 Admissions

For the first time, students seeking admission to DU in 2023 will be required to take the Common University Entrance Test (CUET).

New Admission (CUET): To be admitted to UG courses at Delhi University, students must pass the CUET 2022 exam.

CUET Exam Pattern: The entrance exam will be divided into three sections. The first is language, the second is "domain-specific topics," and the third is general knowledge, which will be required only for admission to the BA programmes.

- For DU admission 2022, candidates must appear in at least one of the 33 languages.

- Candidates must select at least three subjects from their 12th-grade curriculum as domain-specific topics for section 2.

- Candidates may take the CUET in a maximum of six subjects, one of which must be a language.

Selection Criteria: The merit will be calculated based on the marks obtained in the CUET 2022.

Counselling: Candidates who have passed the CUET exam 2022 must register on the DU website for centralised e-counselling. There will be two sessions of counselling. Students will be able to fill out their college preferences on the DU website.

Depending on their CUET scores, students will also have the option to revise their preferences in the second round of counselling.

Admission through Sports and Extracurricular Activities (ECA): Candidates must take a performance test in addition to the CUET. Candidates will be chosen based on their combined CUET (25%) and performance test scores (75%). Certificates, in addition to the CUET 2022 score, will be considered.

Seat Reservation for Minority Colleges: In colleges such as St. Stephens, half of the seats are reserved for minorities. CUET exam 2022 will account for 85% of admission marks, with colleges deciding the remaining 15%. Admission to the remaining 50% of seats will be based solely on CUET result 2023.

Delhi University UG 2023 Selection Process

Candidates seeking admission to UG courses must take the NTA's Common University Entrance Test (CUET UG). The selection will be made through e-counselling by Delhi University based on CUET scores. Candidates seeking admission through Sports and Extracurricular Activities (ECA) must take a performance test in addition to the CUET. Candidates will be chosen based on their combined CUET (25%) and performance test scores (75%). Certificates, in addition to the CUET score, will be considered.

Undergraduate students are admitted to DU depending on their qualifying examination performance. There will be a CUET Entrance Examination for UG Courses Admission for some undergraduate degree programmes, as admissions will be provided based on the score attained in the CUET 2023 entrance examination.

Following the announcement of the CUET 2023 results, the University will release a list of shortlisted UG candidates. The merit list will be made available to all registered candidates at that time. The names of those who have been shortlisted for the counselling procedure, as well as their ranks, will appear on the merit list. Candidates will also be called to the counselling procedure based on their admissions merit list position.

The CUET 2023 merit list will also be published by the CUET participating universities. Candidates who have met the cut-off scores and rank and are qualified for counselling are listed on the merit list. Candidates should be informed that the minimal requirements for relevant subjects vary based on the participating universities.

Candidates chosen for various UG programmes from the CUET 2023 merit list must attend an online/offline counselling session at a participating university. Finally, the admission screening committee will make the final choice.

Note: For international student admission, Delhi University has designated a 'Foreign Students Advisor' to handle all foreign student inquiries. Interested candidates should contact the Foreign Students Advisor's office during normal business hours.
